Soloy Aviation Solutions delivers Portable Heliport to the US Coast Guard in Seward, Alaska

In July 2007 Soloy Aviation Solutions delivered a Portable Heliport to the USCG for use in Alaska (see picture below). The Soloy Portable Heliport was installed on Rugged Island off the Alaskan coast and will provide safe access to the remote location for emergency crews and for periodic antenna maintenance.

The heliport is supporting the USCG with the modernizing of the outdated national distress communications system. The new system called "Rescue 21" will be the nation's primary maritime emergency system for boaters navigating the coastal and inter coastal waters.

This delivery highlights increased interest in the Soloy Heliport, which was developed and marketed by helicopter pioneer Joe Soloy in the early 1970s through the 1980s. The Soloy Portable Heliports feature extreme durability, lightweight construction and fully adjustable legs that allow a wide variety of applications and terrain and comes in three standard sizes to accommodate most all light and medium size helicopters.
